## PASS-FAIL REQUEST

Students may elect to enroll up to 12 credits on a pass-fail basis during their undergraduate career at Furman. No student may elect the pass-fail option for more than 8 credits in a single term. Students on academic probation may not exercise this option, nor may any student who has ever been suspended for academic reasons.

Courses enrolled on a pass-fail basis may not satisfy a general education requirement and no foreign language or mathematics courses may be enrolled on a pass-fail basis until the student has satisfied the general education requirement in the respective area. Students may not elect the pass-fail grading option for any course offered through their major department and no course in which a passing (P) or marginal pass (PD) grade has been recorded may contribute to a student's major requirements unless specifically designated by the major department.

Students may elect the pass-fail grading option for any course they have enrolled consistent with stated eligibility rules no later than mid-term through Academic Records. At that time, students indicate the lowest acceptable traditional letter grade for the course that they would accept. Withdrawal from a course graded on a pass-fail basis will not contribute to the 12 credit limit on this option. Courses graded pass-fail only will normally contribute to meeting the 12 credit pass-fail grading option limit.

All courses that a student completes on a pass-fail basis contribute to the 12 credit pass-fail grading option limit, regardless of the final disposition of the grade, converted or not.

LOWEST ACCEPTABLE TRADITIONAL LETTER GRADE:	
<p>Instructors are not aware of which students have elected the pass-fail grading option, at the end of the term they will submit a traditional letter grade for each student. If the traditional letter grade earned is equal to or greater than the lowest acceptable grade designated by the student, the traditional letter grade is recorded. Traditional letter grades below the lowest acceptable grade designated by the student are converted as follows: satisfactory or better (C- and higher) to passing (P); marginal (D+, D and D-) to marginal pass (PD); and failing (F) to not passing (NP). Grades of P, PD and NP do not affect student grade point averages. Students may alter the lowest acceptable grade designation through Academic Records until the conclusion of the course adjustment period of the next semester.</p>
