Remember that the total cost of the program of study including all expenses should fall into the \$5,000 – 7,000 range. Generally this would exclude the credit-bearing study abroad programs of American colleges and universities, those conducted on the model of Furman's faculty-led programs: we place emphasis on the candidate's individual initiative and independence as a study abroad participant. Appropriate programs might include those FLE (*Français langue étrangère*) programs offered by a wide variety of French language schools and universities during the summer months, or the classes sponsored by various Alliance Française centers throughout France.
