- Opportunities are available year-round. A supportive and dynamic local community consisting of over 300 organizations, representing business, government, arts and non-profits, offer internships for Furman students; part-time during the academic year and full-time in the summer.
- Internships are available through study away and internship classes are offered for credit in most majors. Thanks to support from alumni, parents and friends of Furman, the university has a growing network of contacts from a broad range of professions.
- Summer fellowship program provides funding. Students who have full-time summer internships have the opportunity to apply for competitive fellowship to support their summer experience – across all majors.
