

May Experience 2022 Housing Scholarship Application

The May Experience is Furman University's optional three-week term that takes place following Spring commencement.

Academic Dates: May 11-June 1, 2022

Housing Dates: Students living on campus during the Spring semester will remain in their Spring housing assignments in the time between the end of the Spring semester and through May X. May X housing ends at 12 p.m. June 2, 2022. Students staying in campus housing for May X and Summer 1 will transition from Spring housing/May X housing to their Summer space later in the May X session. Housing and Residence Life will communicate this date to students.

Cost: There is no additional tuition charge for May Experience. The 2022 rate has yet to be set for campus housing and 33 meals.

Eligibility for Housing Scholarship:

- Students who currently receive need-based financial aid and those who may be eligible for such need.
- Students must have a current Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form on file with Furman's financial aid office, as this form is the primary determinant of financial need. *(Note: If your financial contingencies as reflected on the FAFSA do not provide an accurate picture of your financial needs, provide additional information when prompted in the application below.)*

Scholarship Application deadline: 12 p.m. Monday, March 28, 2022. Applicants will be notified in time to meet the Friday, April 1, 2022 deadline to submit their May Experience Housing Application. Housing assignments will be released prior to April 14, 2022.
